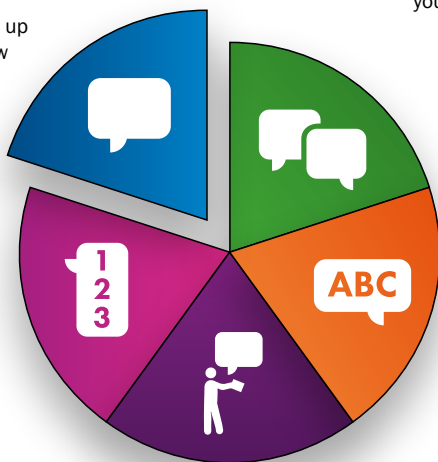
IS YOUR SCHOOL UP FOR DEBATE ?

Content for the best facts, explanations and evidence to stand up strongly in the new post-truth era

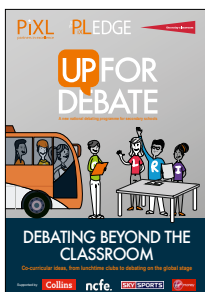
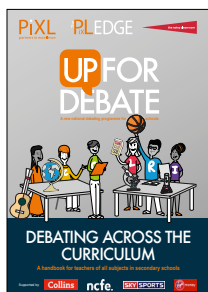
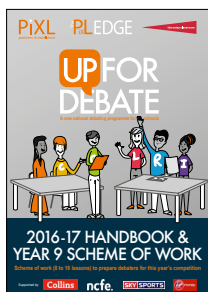
Responses to develop agile young critical thinkers who *really* listen to and consider their opponents' ideas
