The campaigners behind the 2019 school climate change strikes say 1.9 million went on strike and didn't attend school during the protest days this year.

Some schools encouraged their students to strike, but some schools punished pupils for missing a day of school.

Other schools said it would be better for students to stay in school and to learn about more effective ways to campaign.

KEY VOCABULARY: STRIKE

Strike (noun)

A strike is when a group of employees refuse to work, usually as a form of protest, in an attempt to get their employer to agree to certain demands.

Children generally don't work, so instead they can strike by not attending school. The difference is that children want politicians to listen to them, not their schools and teachers.
